This year, we've expanded the program to **include graduating Grade 12 students**! Students must have a **valid driver's license**. Why should students get involved?

- Earn high school credits: For every 100 hours of work, students can earn 1 high school credit.
- Hands-on experience: Students gain experience enhancing their skills and job prospects.
- Variety of placements: We have placements available in the following trades: Lineman, Flooring, Masonry, Auto Mechanic, Construction, Sprinkler Systems, Agricultural Mechanic, Plumbing, Sheet Metal, Refrigeration, Electrician, Welding, and more ...

Student applications will be available on April 1 and will close on May 9. Please note that we are firm on these deadlines, so we encourage students to apply early and ensure their applications are complete.

# 6. Skills/Compétences Canada

The national competition for <u>Skills Competences CA</u> is about advancing the engagement of youth in the areas of skilled trade and technology careers.

The provincial competition for Skills Saskatchewan will take place on **March 28, 2025** in **Saskatoon**. The gold medal competitor will be invited to compete in the national competition.

RDIEC is once again providing a bus from Engelheim up to Saskatoon for Regina and area students who are participating. That is getting organized right now. There is room for about 50 students.

The 2025 Skills Canada National Competition will take place in **Regina, Saskatchewan** on **May 29** and **30, 2025**. The event will be held at the Regina Exhibition Association Limited (REAL) District.

The Skills Canada National Competition **requires 4 external judges** to help judge our Job Search Competition. RDIEC, educational & industry partners are invited to be one of 2 judges who will **help judge presentations** prepared by the competitors on Friday, May 30th. Another 2 judges are required to **help with the interview process** on Friday, May 30 - questions, answers and scoring are prepared and in place by the Job Search Committee and are identical for all competitors.
