Proud to be truly invested in Canadian Agriculture, Richardson created the Bennett Farm, a 444-acre research and demonstration farm, allowing to test the latest seed varieties, crop input products and equipment in real growing conditions. This spotlight will feature every aspect from field to fork.

- What is Agronomy? How are seeds and plants tracked to help produce the biggest yields?

The Saskatchewan Youth Internship Program provides students the chance to gain hands-on experience in various trades while earning high school credits. This year, we've expanded the program to **include graduating Grade 12 students**! Students must have a **valid driver's license**. Why should students get involved?

- Earn high school credits: For every 100 hours of work, students can earn 1 high school credit.
- Hands-on experience: Students gain experience enhancing their skills and job prospects.
- Variety of placements: We have placements available in the following trades:
 Lineman, Flooring, Masonry, Auto Mechanic, Construction, Sprinkler Systems, Agricultural Mechanic, Plumbing, Sheet Metal, Refrigeration, Electrician, Welding, and more ...
