

AUTO BODY SKILLS TRAINING

STUDENT/PARENT INFORMATION

Regina District Industry Education Council (RDIEC) represents Regina Public School Division, Regina Catholic School Division, Prairie Valley School Division and File Hills Qu'Appelle Tribal Council. The RDIEC's **Skills Training** program provides an opportunity for interested Grade 10-12 students to obtain entry level skills and industry recognized safety training certification. Participating students also may have the opportunity to obtain a high school credit upon completion of the work experience component. This program involves 3 steps. <p>1) Skill Acquisition</p> <p>25 hours (Mandatory)</p> <p>This is an introduction to the career area and basic skill development. This can be anywhere from a 25 hour commitment. During this phase, the students will acquire industry specific entry level skills in the career highlighted. During the last hours of this experience, potential employers from industry may be invited in to meet the students and view the skills they have learned. The benefit to industry is to identify students that may have a skill set conducive to employment with them.</p>	<p>2) Career Safety Education</p> <p>25 hours (Mandatory)</p> <p>Students will have to complete the following:</p> <p>a) Young Workers Readiness Certificate, WHMIS 2015, Mental Health Wellness Training, **</p> <p>b) Hearing Protection & Respiratory Protection Training</p> <p>**DUE Nov. 14, 2025. To COMPLETE the courses go to www.sasksafety.org/training/youth/career-safety-education</p>	<p>3) Career Work Exploration High School Credit(CWEX)</p> <p>50 hours (Optional)</p> <p>If students want to continue this program, there may be the option for them to complete a work experience placement related to the skills they acquired and earn a Career and Work Experience credit (CWEX) on their high school transcript. The total time commitment must be 100 hours. In order for students to be able to access this opportunity, they must complete all the skill acquisition and safety training.</p>

This Skills Training will focus on **Auto Body** at Saskatchewan Polytechnic Regina Campus. Students should be interested in the skilled trades and have time in their personal schedules to fulfill the commitment of this program. Students must dress appropriately for working in this industry. **Steel toed boots are required.**

Interested students will have the opportunity to learn about the Auto Body trade. Students will meet at **Saskatchewan Polytechnic Regina Campus** for each of their skill building sessions. **The program runs for 5 Fridays starting on Friday, October 3, from 1:00 pm-5:30 pm and the last session is on Friday, November 14th.** Students should arrive 10 minutes prior to each session starting.

The Career Safety Education Program is offered by the Saskatchewan Safety Council in partnership with WorkSafe Saskatchewan. **Students will complete the Career Safety Education online at no cost.** The value of the Safety Training is approximately \$250.
